**Maine Revised Statutes Annotated, Title 22, § 3104(14) – Statewide food stamp program
Prohibition Against Denial of Assistance Based on Drug Conviction.**

A person who is otherwise eligible to receive food assistance under the federal Food Stamp Act of 1977, 7 U.S.C. §§ 2011 - 2036 may not be denied assistance because the person has been convicted of a drug-related felony as described in the federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996 (“PRWORA”), Public Law 104-193, § 115, 110 Stat. 2105.

**Maine Revised Statutes Annotated, Title 22, §3762(17) – Temporary assistance for needy families (“TANF”); promotion of economic self-support
Prohibition Against Denial of Assistance Based on Drug Conviction.**

A person who is otherwise eligible to receive TANF may not be denied assistance because the person has been convicted of a drug-related felony as described in Section 115 of PRWORA.
